The Claims Register in Release 5.0 includes a number of enhancements that should be beneficial to both court staff and outside users. One of the more prominent new features is the ability to combine and view multiple documents from the Claims Register in one PDF file.

Prior to Release 5.0, users could only view multiple documents in the Docket Report. We'll now run a Claims Register report and view multiple documents in CM/ECF.



Note that when the View multiple documents check box is selected, the View claims summary report selection is grayed out. We'll discuss the View claims summary report option later in this lesson. Click Run Report.




When the View multiple documents option is selected, the Claims Register report will include a check box next to each claim, claim attachment, or claim related proceeding. Claim related entries are copied directly from the docket report for more history of this claim.

To include all documents in the Claims Register in one large PDF file, click Select All. That way, you don't have to print each claim and related filing separately. In this example, I will select three documents by clicking the corresponding check boxes.



The option to View Selected or Download Selected documents displays at the end of this screen. When multiple documents are selected, all documents are presented in one concatenated (or linked) PDF/A document.

The court may have a restriction on the size of PDF files. If the total file size of the selected documents exceeds the court's maximum file size limit, an error message will display. I'll now click View Selected.



In addition to viewing multiple documents, a claims register summary report is now available to PACER users. This option condenses all claims on the case to a simplified list.

The familiar selection fields are available to produce a partial summary by creditor, claim number, or date range. So a claims summary of the entire claims register can be produced or you may generate a partial summary based on your needs.



To generate a claims summary report, we'll return to the Claims Register screen. In this example, the case number is already populated.

Remember, you can generate a partial report for specific claims of interest to you by first filtering the data by creditor name, claim number range, or date range. I'll now click the View claims summary report check box...






Here's an example of the claims summary report. You may sort the table by clicking the claim number, date filed, or creditor name by clicking the column header. With this new feature, you can easily view a simple list of selected claims or all claims.

Also notice that resting on the amount claimed for each claim will display a breakdown of the claim amounts.








